Chocolate Flower

 Low to moderate water

 Full sun to part shade

 Attracts butterflies

 Native to N. Mexico, SW U.S.



Why we love it...

These adorable little daisy-like flowers will brighten your warm-season mornings with sunny yellow color and the unmistakable scent of chocolate! The maroon center of the flower provides a perfect landing pad for the butterflies that flock to it for nectar. Native to northern Mexico, southeastern Arizona, and Texas; the hardy Chocolate Flower will tolerate temperatures as low as -30°F, often freezing to the ground in winter only to come back bigger and fuller next season. Though classified as a perennial, it can be grown anywhere as an annual, and will readily drop seeds that sprout into new plants in spring!



Lydia says: If your chocolate flower starts to look leggy or tattered, you can refresh it any time by cutting it back to promote new growth!
